READ Matthew 4:1-11

MEDITATE

This week, try letting your heart break for the world in a new way, knowing that God will transfigure and transform every valley, every sorrow, and every cross.

Read the news as a spiritual practice, praying for all of us caught up in the webs of violence, poverty, injustice, and war. Like so many of our ancestors, we can pray prayers of lamentation: "God of Moses and Elijah, come heal our world! Come mend our broken hearts! Come with your love, peace, and justice – let them flow like a mighty stream!" And we can also pray prayers of gratitude and celebration for what God is already doing to transfigure despair into hope, mourning into dancing, hate into love.

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) NEWS - As flu season continues and in light of the current outbreak of a new coronavirus (COVID-19), Church of the Redeemer is reviewing our procedures to ensure a safe, compassionate, caring environment for all.

While worshiping, we encourage the following practices to help avoid the spread of any and all infectious diseases:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Please note that alcohol-based liquid hand sanitizer dispensers are also available throughout the church.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- If you are feeling ill, please stay home. Although we will miss your presence, we want you to rest so you can feel better sooner.
- While sharing the Peace, you may consider bowing to one another, fist bumps, elbow bumps, friendly waves, or peace signs.
- During this time at the Eucharist, we encourage you to avoid intinction (the dipping of the bread into the wine) and instead drink from the common cup. Intinction does little to avoid the spread of disease and may actually increase the spread as the bread spends more time in the (possibly unclean) hand before being dipped into the wine. If you decide you would prefer not to receive the cup at all that is okay. The Church believes that receiving in one kind (just the consecrated bread) is to fully partake in the Eucharistic feast.

Please be assured that all of our Eucharistic Ministers and Clergy will be using hand sanitizer prior to administering the Eucharist and per their training, our Eucharistic Ministers wipe the inside and outside rim of the chalice with a clean section of the purificator between each communicant.
